I then worked as a Groundsman for a Tree Surgery Company and then quickly became one of the climbers too, here I honed my skills and understanding of all things Arboricultural, especially my love of the maintenance and preservation of Listed Trees and also my passion for topiary.

I suffered a small accident at work and decided to cease doing tree work only to land another job as head climber for a tree surgery and maintenance company! I was also a team leader and did Tree Surveys and consultancy work.

After this, I set up and ran my own successful Landscaping and tree surgery company for over ten years where I employed up to six people working on high end landscape projects and tree preservation and grounds maintenance.

For the last ten years I have been Head Gardener for a large private family estate in Surrey. I was responsible for an area close on 27 acres, which included formal lawns, huge formal rose garden, formal courtyard and also a large kitchen garden and orchard. As well as this I assumed the role of Estate Manager and dealt with all that entailed with the maintenance of a large equestrian facility and I was also the contact for all outside trades and craftsmen.

Whilst working in my last role I started to volunteer for HighGround at Headley Court once a week and soon became hooked on Horticultural Therapy. I learnt a lot from HighGround's Horticultural Therapist in my two years of volunteering, and I have bought many books and read many papers on the subject.

I bring to my role over 30 Years of practical knowledge of Horticulture and Arboriculture and also as a keen follower of Nature I am someone who understands how the natural cycle of the seasons affects what we do.
